Frank Lloyd Wright: On the Road to Broadacre City

Sunday, May 7

4:30 pm Cole Auditorium

Professor Craig Buckley's lecture will provide an overview of key works in Frank Lloyd Wright's oeuvre in light of his changing attitude to the city from his early career in Chicago to his proposal for Broadacre City, designed with students from the Taliesin fellowship during the depression in the 1930s. Broadacre City, the most utopian of Wright's plans, will be considered in light of utopian city plans developed during the interwar years by European modernists.



Buckley is an Assistant Professor of History of Art, Modern and Contemporary Architecture at Yale College. He completed his

MA at the University of Western Ontario, attended the Whitney Independent Study Program in New York, and received his Ph.D. from Princeton University in 2013.

His research centers on the history of modern architecture and the experiments of the historical avant-garde, the publishing and media practices of architects, and the relationship between artistic and architectural movements throughout the 20th century.

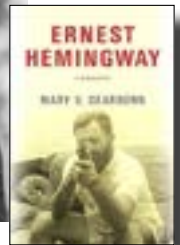
Emma Cline

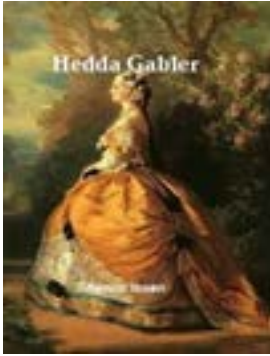

Meet Mary V. Dearborn, author of the first full biography of *Hemingway* in more than fifteen years. A revelatory look into the life and work of the winner of the 1954 Nobel Prize in Literature; a rich and nuanced portrait of a complex, enigmatic American artist, whose seven novels and six short story collections inform fiction writing generations after his death.

Dearborn draws upon a massive cache of papers Hemingway left behind when he fled his Cuban farm in 1961, his complete FBI file detailing his wartime experience of German submarines in the Caribbean, recently opened KGB archive connecting Hemingway to the KGB as a "recruitment," Hemingway family papers, and more.

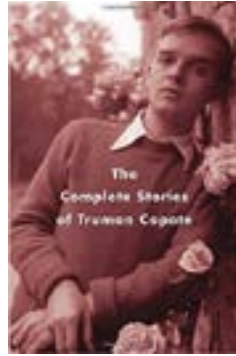

Hedda Gabler is a play written by Norwegian playwright Henrik Ibsen, who was present at the world premiere on January 31, 1891 at the Residenztheater in Munich. The play is recognized as a classic of realism, nineteenth-century theater, and world drama. The title character, Hedda, is considered one of the greatest dramatic roles in theater.

Dr. Mark J. Schenker has been at Yale College since 1990. He is currently a senior associate dean of the College and dean of academic affairs. A former lecturer in the English Department, he received his Ph.D. from Columbia University with a concentration in 19th-century and early 20th-century English literature.

In 2001, Schenker received the Wilbur Cross Award for Outstanding Humanities Scholar, presented by the Connecticut Humanities Council.

Cambodia: Looking Back on the Future takes a deeper look at contemporary art in Cambodia, exploring notions of time, identity and history. Central to all the works selected for the exhibition is the human figure. The figure, like in traditional art forms, is an important device for many artists to assert personal narratives, implying significance and meaning in the context of larger historical events.

This exhibition represents the largest known presentation of artwork by Cambodian visual artists in the U.S. It includes work by eleven contemporary Cambodian artists that are both established and emerging. This show brings together a variety of medium including painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture, installation and video/performance.

Exhibiting artists include: ANIDA YOEU ALI, CHATH PIERSATH, CHOV Theanly, HENG Ravuth, KONG VOLLAK, LEANG Seckon, LIM Muy Theam, Marine KY, NEAK Sophal, OEUR Sokuntevy and YIM Maline. (For this exhibition, family names are shown in capital letters or in bold, for easy understanding - in Cambodia family names come first, while artists who grew up abroad usually list their family names last.)

Artwork is for sale and commissions help support the programs of the Friends of Greenwich Library.

During the course of the exhibition, the gallery will present several public programs including film screenings, talks and performances that will further expand on topics that are important for understanding and appreciating contemporary art in Cambodia today. 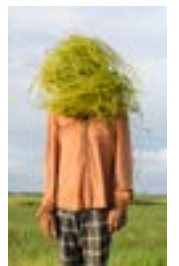

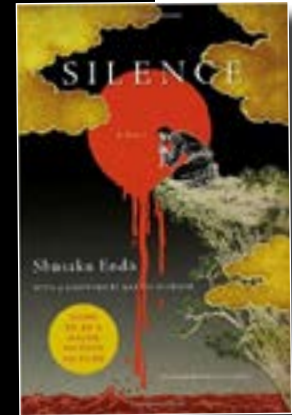
