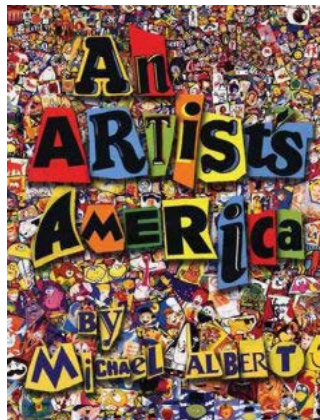
Build a Better World Photocollage Workshop

MoMA's exhibition Frank Lloyd Wright at 150: Unpacking the Archive, curated by Barry Bergdoll, offers an unprecedented opportunity to explore the work and practice of one of the most prolific and renowned architects of the twentieth century.
