Made from a place of deep love and fascination, the film covers the intersecting stories of Pulitzer Prize-winning author Robert Caro and his iconic editor Robert Gottlieb as they race to complete their life's joint work. Rated PG. 1h52m.

Broadway leading man Ben Platt is the co-writer and star of this loving comedy dedicated to theater kids and the power of live performance, leading a cast that includes Amy Sedaris and The Bear's Ayo Edebiri. When the director of a theater camp falls into a coma, her eccentric staff must rally with her good-hearted but clueless "cryptobro" son to keep the camp going for the kids. Portraying a year in the life of the Smith family in turnof-the-century St. Louis, the Oscarwinning film includes the debuts of Garland standards "The Trolley Song," "The Boy Next Door" and "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas," Rated G. 1h53m.

Indiana Jones and the **Dial of Destiny** (2023)

Harrison Ford dons the hat and the whip for a final ride as archaeologist Indiana Jones, a man finding himself feeling out of place in the space age. Soon enough, his goddaughter (Phoebe Waller-Bridge) pulls him into a mystery to prevent a powerful ancient artifact from falling into the hands of Nazis he'd fought decades ago. Rated PG-13, 2h35m.

Living (2022)

Bill Nighy stars as a bureaucratic cog in the rebuilding of post-WWII Britain whose outlook on the purpose of life changes when he is diagnosed with a fatal illness. Nighy and the film's screenplay by Nobel Laureate Kazuo Ishiguro were both nominated for Oscars for bringing this transportive, poignant film to life. Rated PG-13. 1h42m.
