



Tom Hiddleston, Mark Hamill and Chiwetel Ejiofor star in the story of a young man experiencing the wonder of love, the heartbreak of loss, and the multitudes contained within us all. Based on a poignant novella by Stephen King, the life-affirming film spins a unique tale that encourages us to reflect on how each life contains a universe all its own. Rated PG-13. 1h50m.




Folktales (2025)



In conjunction with the Flinn Gallery's show "Performative Stories," we are thrilled to present this dazzling animated odyssey inspired by Arabic folklore. Told with a distinct artistic style, the silent film is packed with visual splendor in relaying Prince Achmed's epic adventures with Aladdin and other mythic characters. Don't miss the chance to see the world's oldest surviving animated feature film! Unrated (family friendly). 1h5m.

Keep On Keepin' On (2014)

After enjoying Jazzmeia Horn's performance at the Peterson Music Concert on February 2, keep your love of jazz going with this sweet documentary film about legendary trumpeter Clark Terry who played with the likes of Count Basie and Duke Ellington. Many of the famous musicians taught by Terry such as Quincy Jones appear in the film – an ode to his career, which also depicts his bond with a blind pianist prodigy he is mentoring. Come celebrate Black History Month with this cinematic love letter to passing on a passion from generation to generation. Rated R for some language. 1h24m.

The Wedding Banquet (2025)

Just in time for Valentine's Day, join us for this romantic comedy of errors starring *SNL*'s Bowen Yang, Oscar nominee Lily Gladstone and Oscar winner Youn Yuh-jung. Unhappy with the prospect of returning to Korea to work for his family's business, an art student with a commitment-phobic boyfriend proposes a green card marriage to his lesbian friend – but things get complicated when his grandmother arrives to throw him an extravagant wedding. Rated R for language and some sexual material. 1h45m.

Miracle (2004)

To close out the Winter Olympics, come celebrate this rousing sports drama starring Kurt Russell. The film follows the true story of America's ice hockey team as it prepares to face the heavily-favored Soviet team at the 1980 Olympics. As the squad aims to take on insurmountable odds, their story inspires a nation in the throes of Cold War tension and shows the power we can have when we come together as a team. Rated PG. 2h15m.

The Fallen Idol (1948)

In this terrific thriller, a butler working in London falls under suspicion when a mysterious death occurs in the house, with the only witness being an impressionable young boy who admires him deeply. The film received Oscar nominations for its direction by Carol Reed (*Oliver!* and *The Third Man*) and its script by Graham Greene, adapting his own short story. Unrated. 1h35m.

REEL TALK: After the screening, stay with us for a Q&A with Robert Henrey who starred in the film as a child. Since his time in the movies, Robert has settled in Greenwich and enjoyed a long career in finance, served as an interfaith chaplain at Greenwich Hospital, and written books including his memoir "*Through Grown-Up Eyes: Living With Childhood Fame*."
