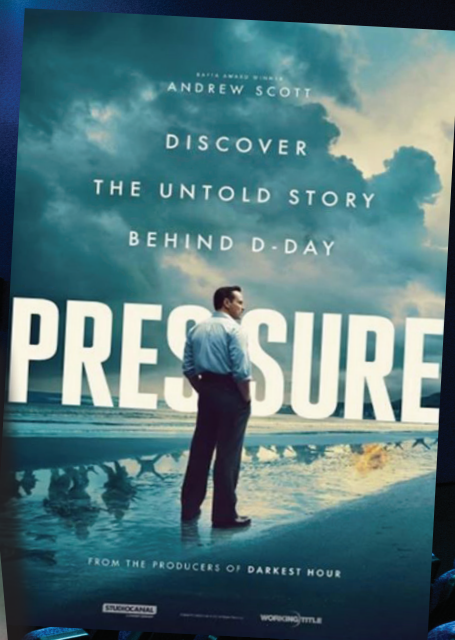

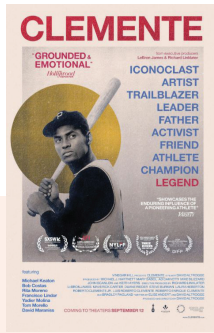

For Hispanic Heritage Month, join us to celebrate the life and career of Baseball Hall of Famer Roberto Clemente. Told through stunning archival footage and never-before-heard interviews from the legend himself, this documentary explores how Clemente's remarkable feats were not limited to the field: while he broke down barriers on his way from Puerto Rico to Major League Baseball stardom, he never lost sight of the importance of helping marginalized communities. 1h40m. The Devil Wears Prada 2

Meryl Streep, Anne Hathaway, Stanley Tucci and Emily Blunt all return from *The Devil Wears Prada* for this fabulously fashionable sequel to the 2007 comedy—screened to coincide with Milan Fashion Week! With *Runway* magazine in danger of a hostile corporate takeover and the future of her job and print media itself in question, fashion editor-in-chief Miranda Priestly (Streep) finds her best chance at survival lies in the return of her former assistant-turned-journalist (Hathaway). 2h. Rated PG-13.

The film will be introduced by Renée Amory Ketcham, who worked as the Model Editor at Vogue (upon which the film's fictional magazine is based) in the 1980s under the late Editor-in-Chief Grace Mirabella. 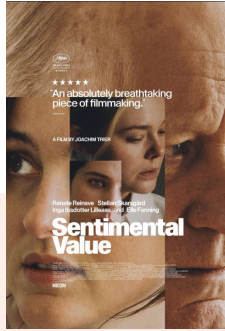

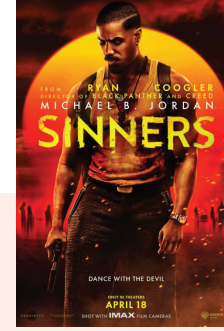


Sentimental Value

2h12m. Rated R for some language and brief nudity. Norwegian and English.

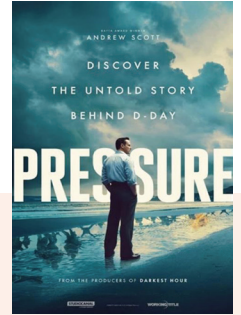

Rescheduled! Come get ready for Halloween with the most Oscar-nominated movie of all time: garnering sixteen total including Best Picture and Director, the film won Best Actor (Michael B. Jordan), Original Screenplay and Score. A masterful fusion of romance, music, and supernatural horror elements yields a singular period piece you won't soon forget as troubled twin brothers return to their hometown to start over, only to find a greater evil waiting than the one they left behind. 2h17m. Rated R for strong bloody violence, sexual content and language.

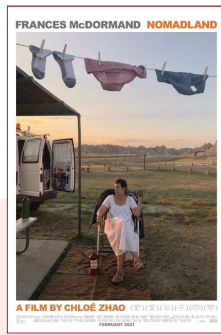


The Automat

This delightful documentary covers the fascinating story of the Horn & Hardart automat, an eating establishment woven into the history of New York City and Philadelphia as a place where generations of Americans from diverse backgrounds enjoyed food, coffee, and conversation together. In this heartfelt look at history, Mel Brooks and Carl Reiner are among the devoted customers sharing cherished reminiscences alongside insights from historians and descendants of those who created and sustained the iconic restaurant chain. 1h20m. Rated PG.

Visit the Flinn Gallery's Art Lounge for their show "The Shifting Landscape," and then come see Chloe Zhao's stunning drama about a woman (Frances MacDormand) who packs up everything for a nomadic existence in the American west. Zhao's poetic style blurs the lines of fiction and documentary filmmaking, immersing viewers in her characters' search for belonging and connection—with each other, and the land. The film won Best Picture, Director, and Actress Oscars in 2021, and was also nominated for Best Adapted Screenplay and Cinematography. 2h. Rated R for brief full nudity.

I Swear

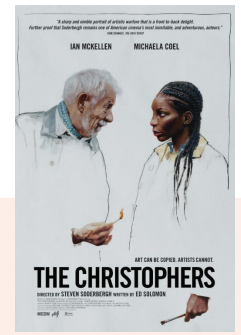
